
JANUARY SPEAKER CONGRESSMAN MATT GAETZ

Dear Sirs:

I am writing to ask you to **VOTE AGAINST SB 438**, and its companion **HB 57**, which will prevent county commissioners from seeking reelection if they have already served eight (8) consecutive years in their current position. Please consider my reasoning below.

The position of County Commissioner includes many responsibilities, most of which are unknown or invisible to constituents. Even so, it is obvious that such a complex position could take a newly elected individual most of their first term to become proficient. Gaining a solid understanding of procedures, departmental needs, staff skills, and citizenry's needs, especially in a medium to large county, would require extensive, intense study.

County commissioners are closer to the citizenry they represent than at another level of government and are available to speak to and meet with the citizens frequently. That relationship does not exist at either the State or Federal level. Given the opportunity for such a close working relationship, citizens are in a position to decide quickly when a particular elected official is not doing a good job, and home rule allows us to decide for ourselves when we want to vote a commissioner out of office.

A commissioner should be voted out of office when they stop being responsive to the needs of their constituents, not at some arbitrary future point in time. Whether commissioners are being responsive can only be decided by the constituents they serve, not by the legislature, which is completely removed from the workings of individual counties.

The Okaloosa County Commission is very fiscally conservative while being functionally progressive. Okaloosa County Commission is responsive to its citizens and provides an appropriate level of accessible service on a cost-effective basis as it relates to infrastructure, growth management, and all other areas of governmental service.

The needs of Okaloosa County do not compare with the needs of Miami-Dade County nor does it compare with the needs of Liberty County. It is inappropriate in the extreme to believe that the State legislature should affect such a uniformly sweeping change to such disparate governmental subdivisions just because someone somewhere thinks term limits are a good idea.

I urge you to reconsider these bills and vote against their passage.
